FREE LEGAL HELP EDUCATION LEGAL RIGHTS.

The **Education Legal Rights Project** provides free legal representation to students with needs that are not being met in the school system because of a learning disability, physical, mental or emotional disability, other health impairment or disabling condition under the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (*IDEA*) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act.

IDEA ensures that all children with disabilities affecting their education have available to them a "free and appropriate public education" that provides special education accomodations and related services designed to meet each student's unique needs and prepare them for further education, employment, and independent living. Legal Aid provides free legal assistance to income-eligible residents of Broward County.

Do you believe your child is having difficulty succeeding in school?

Should he or she be evaluated for Special Education Services?

Is your child receiving Special Education Services, but not making adequate progress?

SERVICES THAT MAY BE AVAILABLE

- Assisting students in receiving timely testing, ESE (exceptional student education) eligibility determinations, and proper placement
- Ensuring the student receives appropriate, timely and effective special education support, services, and accomodations
- Attendance and representation of students at Individual Education Plan (IEP) meetings
- Representation at mediation, administrative hearings and due process hearings, and in litigation when necessary
- Referrals as appropriate to outside social service organizations

STUDENT RIGHTS

- · To receive a free and appropriate public education
- · To be educated in the least restrictive environment that meets the student's needs
- · To expect teachers to have high expectations of progress
- To make meaningful progress and gain educational benefit
- · To receive appropriate supports and related services within a timely manner
- · To receive necessary evaluations in a timely manner
- · To receive appropriate transitional services
- · To be a student with a disability and not a disabled student
- · To have a voice in their educational planning
